


Our curriculum at Summerlea is creative and designed to forge links between the different areas of learning. Each topic we study is led by a big question to get us thinking. We have listed the **main** curriculum areas that will be

addressed through each question and have given a brief outline of what we will be learning.

This half term our big question will be...

Ancient Greece: Where's the Evidence?



The key drivers for this topic are

History and Design Technology.

Our key vocabulary for this topic:

amphitheatre, trojan horse, chiton, agora, Hoplite, Hellenistic, pyxis

History:

This half term, we will be researching Ancient Greek life and achievements, and how those clever Greeks dramatically influenced our lives today. Within this, we will focus on Greek mythology, democracy, food, lifestyles and the Olympics. We will also be using atlases and maps to locate Greece and other European countries, and to identify how and why the Greek Empire grew so successfully.

As part of our investigation into Greek mythology, we will be analysing the typical features of written Greek myths. The children will be creating their own myths, complete with gruesome mythical beasts, evil kings and fearless heroes. We are looking forward to reading their work and sharing it with you all later in the term!

Design and Technology:

For design technology, the children will be learning about how to prepare food typical of Ancient Greece.





RSHCE:

During this half term our topic is citizenship - we will be discussing human rights, caring for others, prejudice and discrimination. We learn the value of diversity and what democracy means in this country and look at our ever-changing environment.

Mathematics:

The children will continue building their knowledge of the four operations and applying to a range of arithmetic questions. They will also be looking at fractions, decimals and percentages.

Remember to log on regularly to Times Tables Rock Stars to practice your multiplication tables fluency and speed.



English:

In Writing, children will immerse themselves in the world of Greek mythology and create their own Greek myth based on Perseus and Medusa. We will finish by writing a non-chronological report based on a mythical creature. During the writing process children will recap and learn about key grammatical features including progressive tense, verb forms and relative clauses.

Science:

The children will be 'buzzing' with excitement for our electricity topic. We will be creating a range of working circuits and developing our existing knowledge of electricity. Our scientist focus will be Nikola Tesla.

Computing:

We will be exploring coding in computing this half term. The children will be working with Kodu, an exciting coding programme, where they will design their own games!

NB: We ask that your child brings their PE kit to school with them, please ensure that all clothing items are labelled. Long hair should be tied back and earring removed or covered.

Coats/snacks/drinks and equipment:

Children should only bring essential items to school. Please ensure your child has a named waterproof coat in school every day as we will still go out in light rain. We ask that every child has a named water bottle in school and if you are providing a healthy snack for breaktime, that this is separate from their lunch and put into the classroom box as they come in, in the morning. We do ask that <u>all snacks are nut free due to allergies</u>. Children can bring in a wipeable pencil case, that contains <u>essential</u> stationary items only.

Mobile Phones:

If your child brings a mobile phone to school, please ensure you have completed the relevant permissions paperwork with the school office. Phones in school **must remain switched off and in bags** once on the school **site** and may not be used, for any purpose, on school premises, grounds or during off-site school activities. Children must place their phones in the class box as soon as they enter the school building and collected again just before the end of the school day and remain **switched off and in bags until the child is off the school site. This is especially important for children attending after school clubs. The phone should be clearly marked, with name and class of the child to whom it belongs. The school will not take any responsibility for the loss, theft or damage of mobile phones. Children bring them to school entirely at their own risk.**




