






A plea from the Travel Plan Team

Last Friday 12th June we took part in the Big First Aid day with St John's Ambulance. Children in Key Stage 2 watched a live first aid lesson which was streamed to schools around the country and EYFS and Key Stage 1 children attended a special 999 assembly led by Mrs Patridge, who used to work for the police service. The children learnt important life skills during these sessions and their awareness of how we can help keep ourselves and others safe was raised. Arun Wellbeing and the NHS were also invited into school to undertake health checks on the staff. We would like to take this opportunity to let you know that we now have a defibrillator in school. This is located in the main reception area, just outside the headteachers' office. We hope we will never need to use it but it is potentially a lifesaving piece of equipment and therefore one we wanted to invest in in the best interests of our school community.
