

SAINSBURYS SCHOOL GAMES



Three LASP schools had battled through and achieved top places at Southern Area Partnership finals and gained the honour of representing SAP at the prestigious SUSSEX SCHOOL GAMES in July. The event has been likened to the Olympic Games with opening and closing ceremonies and a whole arena of top class players competing in various sports.



There are 68 primary schools within the Southern Area so schools were justifiably proud of going to the K2 to represent the partnership. They now were competing against the top sides from the whole of the County.

All sides had a fantastic day and did themselves, their schools, and LASP proud. St Philip's battled hard with their hockey sticks and came 7th. Lyminster vaulted well and cartwheeled to a SILVER Medal and golfers from Summerlea came up to scratch on the day and took GOLD. Tremendous results when one considers that there are over 500 primary schools.

LASP LEGACY LEAGUE POINT SYSTEM CHANGE

The change has occurred as the LASP PE Coordinators want to place a greater emphasis on 'participation'. 5 points will therefore be awarded to every school which enters a festival or competition. Positional points awarded will depend on number of teams. E.g. if 7 teams enter the winning side will get 7 points [not 14 as was the case] and so on until the team which comes 7th, who will get 1 positional point. Extra points will still be awarded depending on school size. It is hoped that this system will create an even greater level of participation and in addition lead to an even more exciting finish in July 2016. The LASP website www.laspinspires.co.uk will show up to date positions from October half term.

INCLUSION EVENTS



LASP aims to provide sporting opportunities for all children. Last term a number of LASP children participated in festivals and tournaments aimed specifically at youngsters with some learning, sensory and or physical difficulties. During the summer term youngsters from LASP schools participated in a KS1 Sports Festival and competed in Golf, Tennis and Cricket events.

COUNTY RUGBY FINALS



Two of our LASP schools progressed through to the County Tag Rugby championships. Rustington, the best Y5/6 side in the Southern Area Partnership travelled alongside St Marys [best emerging small school in SAP] to compete in the County finals. All players made significant progress in skills and tactics and showed fantastic teamwork during the competition which was a most enjoyable and brilliant experience for all. Despite not 'medalling' they did LASP proud; Mr Bylett and Mr Matthews are chuffed that their squads did so well. Rustington 7th in County and St Marys 5th best small school in County. Well done.
