We are delighted to welcome Mrs Brittany Turvey to our team of brilliant Learning Support Assistants. Mrs Turvey was a Midday Meal Supervisor here at Summerlea and so knows the school and lots of the children well already. She also has two children of her own here. Mrs Turvey will be based in EYFS and Key Stage 1 in the first instance.

Is your child entitled to Free School Meals?

If you get any of the following the answer could be yes!

- Income Support
- Income-based Jobseekers Allowance
- Income-related Employment and Support Allowance
- Support under Part VI of the Immigration and Asylum Act 1999
- The guaranteed element of State Pension Credit
- Child Tax Credit (provided you're not also entitled to Working Tax Credit and have an annual gross income of no more than £16,190)
- Working Tax Credit run-on paid for 4 weeks after you stop qualifying for Working Tax Credit
- Universal Credit

Children who get any of the above benefits in their own right (i.e. they get benefit payments directly, instead of through a parent or guardian) can also get free school meals.

Please remember that even if your child doesn't want to have the free meal they could still benefit in other ways, through the Pupil Premium funding we would receive as a school.

If you think you might qualify, please speak to Mrs Jo Maxted, School Business Manager, in confidence.



Is your child adopted?

The criteria for Adopted children is: Children who have ceased to be looked after by a local authority in England and Wales because of adoption, a special guardianship order, a child arrangements order or a residence order.

If your child is adopted and we are not already aware of this, please do come and speak to us in confidence. We may be able to offer support to you and your child.

Germs

It's very important to wash your hands because even though you can't see them there are lots of little germs on your hands that can spread to others.

In our classes we have been doing an experiment. We have wiped our hands all over a piece of bread. Then we washed our hands and wiped them all over another piece of bread and looked to see if it had changed. You should always wash your hands before and after:

- After you go to the toilet
- Before you eat
- After you sneeze
- After playing with pets
- After playing in the garden
