Ria finished in 4:05:08 and Matt finished in 5:16:55 after getting cramp at the halfway point. From then on he had to walk and run. Disappointed, after the 6 months training, but the thought of dropping out wasn't going to happen. Matt said on the day he would never run another marathon, but by the following day he had registered for next year's Brighton Marathon! Ria really enjoyed her first marathon experience, and has recently applied to take part in London in 2018. Both Ria's husband Tom and children Jack and Brody, and Matt's wife Lea and daughter Freya were cheering them on which gave them the inspiration to finish and complete this challenge for FOSS. We are 'over the moon' that they have raised an incredible £1,178.50! This huge sum of money was presented to the school in a whole school assembly. The Importance of Sleep 29th June 1.15-3pm

My Name is Evelyn Stewart and I am a Paediatric Sleep Practitioner and I work in one of only a handful of NHS Paediatric Sleep Centres in the UK. I also have my own private practice and I teach parents and professional on the subject of sleep.



I have been invited to come along to Summerlea School and talk to parents about sleep and sleep problems in younger children, as well as the link between sleep and learning. During the session I will talk about normal sleep patterns and what we can realistically expect from our children. We will discuss the impact of sleep deprivation on the child who is having difficulties and the family of that child. We will look at the link between behaviour and sleep, as well as looking at common sleep problems such as settling issues at bedtime, night time waking, early risers and we will also talk about night terrors, night mares, sleep walking and snoring. We will also discuss some of the latest research into memory consolidation, learning and sleep.

At the end of the afternoon I will be available to those wishing to chat one to one.

If your child is having sleep problems or you just want to learn more about how sleep affects every aspect of your child's life, including their education, then I hope you will be able to come along.
