Overall Purpose of the Job

• To meet the needs of an individual pupil, with SEND, in your care at lunchtimes under the direction of the Senior Leadership Team, Inclusion Team and Senior Midday Meals Supervisor.

Duties and Responsibilities

- Taking over supervision of a child with special educational needs at the agreed time.
- Supervising the child through transitions such as queueing, moving about the school and using cloakrooms, ensuring hygiene and appropriate behaviour at all times.
- Reinforcing the school's positive behaviour policy, Summerlea Seven Values and rules in accordance with individual behaviour plans.
- Maintaining clear communication with the Inclusion Team, class teacher and other staff who work directly with an individual child.
- Assisting with record keeping.
- Following the Child Protection Policy.
- Participating in any training courses that are relevant to this post as requested.

The successful candidate will be able to engage with children, support and care for them and ensure that their school experience is a positive, safe and happy one.

We encourage all of our MDMS to have a sense of belonging to an important team of staff. Summerlea School is an equal opportunities employer. We are committed to safeguarding and promoting the welfare of children and this post is subject to DBS and pre-employment checks. West Sussex County Council meets the requirements in respect of exempted questions under the Rehabilitation of Offenders Act 1974. The successful candidates will be able to engage with children, support and care for them and ensure that their school experience is a positive, safe and happy one.

We encourage our MDMS to have a sense of belonging to an important team of staff. The MDMS are responsible for supervising the children, ensuring that they have a calm and positive lunchtime experience that is sociable and fun.

All MDMS are then expected to supervise and engage the children in play on the playground, once lunch has been eaten, and liaise with the staff about pupils' individual needs.

Your 6 Step Guide to Ordering School Uniform

- 1. Go to www.yourschooluniform.com and click 'Find your school uniform.'
- 2. Enter your school details to search for your school, then click on the school's logo or name to see the uniform.

NEW STARTERS Help and Advice for Ordering School Uniform

There's a lot to think about when starting a new school, especially when it's a new experience for parents too.

Your school has chosen YourSchoolUniform.com to supply uniform through its online service. We've put together this information to help those ordering for the first time.

Timescales for Ordering Uniform

The second half of July and August are peak times for the school uniform industry. With practically every family with school age children buying new schoolwear. Uniforms with logos are often embroidered to order, generally taking 10-15 days to deliver (at the peak time it may take a little longer). Bearing this in mind, we recommend ordering uniform:

- As early as possible, ideally at the beginning of July (and at the beginning of June for schools in Scotland).
- In plenty of time for it to arrive before you go on holiday, if you are going to be away during the school break.

That way you have time to exchange or order additional items before the new term begins.

What and How Much To Buy

Your school will issue you with the list of uniform items needed, which will probably include some of the items overleaf. We're often asked how many of each you should purchase. This is ultimately down to personal choice, with consideration given to budget and the ability your child has for keeping things clean or attracting dirt throughout the day.

Suggested Quantities of Items

- 1 3 Sweatshirt/Jumper/Cardigan
- 2 5 Shirt/Polo Shirt
 - 1 Blazer
 - 1 Tie
- 1 3 Skirt/Trousers
 - 1 Book Bag
 - 1 of each item in PE Kit
 - 1 PE Kit Bag

Please note, your school will issue you with a list of the required items. This is just a suggestion of how many you may need.

You May Also Need

Outdoor Jacket* Sun Hat* Shoes Drinks Bottle Lunch Box Name Tapes (Lost property is a never ending battle at schools so make sure all items are clearly named.)

New starters at secondary/middle school may need:

Swimming Bag Rucksack or other school bag

*Schools may make these items available with the school logo applied.

If plain items are not included on your school's web page at www.yourschooluniform.com, they can be ordered from the plain range in the section called '**Schoolwear**' on our website.

On the first day, don't forget to make sure the school has your current mobile number and emergency contact details in case these have changed over the summer. (Remember to take some tissues - usually required by parents, not the children!)
