




Electronic gates

Governor Newsletter - spring term 1

Dear Parents and Carers.

A happy new year to you all and welcome to the new Spring Term! Hopefully the winter blues and colds doing the rounds have not affected you or your children too badly. A friend reminded me it is only 66 days until the official start of spring so that might make us all feel a little better. The daffodils springing up in the beautifully kept school gardens remind me that it won't be long until the spring arrives properly.

Whilst talking with a parent at the end of last year I was reminded that many parents are not entirely sure what the job of a school governor is. I thought I would take this opportunity to explain that our role is not necessarily about arranging coffee mornings, although cake may be involved! Our job, as governors, is to focus on three core areas. These are:

- Ensuring clarity of vision, ethos and strategic direction
- Holding the head teacher to account for the educational performance of the school and its pupils and the performance management of staff
- Overseeing the financial performance of the school and making sure its money is well spent

Just as the school has an improvement plan, the governors also have an action plan that focuses on these key areas. When we carry out visits in school we ensure that these are the things foremost in our minds. We have our meetings on a monthly basis and these typically last around 2 hours. However, a lot of our time is used when making school monitoring visits and attending events. We meet with the local authority link adviser, when necessary, as well as attend governing training events held across the county.

It remains a really busy time for staff and governors who are giving a 100% energy and effort to our rapid improvement plan. As governors, we monitor the improvements being made in the school by the dedicated teachers and support staff. We do this in several ways. One of those ways is to meet with key leaders who talk us through their action plans and evidence of impact. We also attend meetings where progress is discussed in year groups and we have been greatly impressed by the diligence of the teachers in providing stimulating and interesting learning opportunities for all Summerlea pupils. The curriculum booklets have been well received by many parents who value the information and use them to support their child/ren at home.

As usual, the school calendar is full of exciting events arranged and supported by the staff at Summerlea. Many of these are clubs taking place before or after school hours and I am certain that the rest of the governors and school community thank them for giving their time to make life fun and fulfilling for the children.

I wanted to mention that our Chartwells school kitchen staff have again achieved the highest rating and thank them for their continued hard work. In this climate of great financial pressure in schools across the county, Mrs Maxted has been very busy gaining the support of Tesco stores and you will see from the recent newsletter of the success of this bid.

I must also thank Mrs Morris and Mrs Strong who I know are out at the school gate each day, come rain or shine, in their high visibility jackets, to greet parents and are available to talk about any matters regarding the school and their children. This open door policy is so vital to communication with parents and carers and I know that Mrs Morris and Mrs Strong value this partnership working.

Finally, many thanks to parents who are able to come into school to help with activities. This support makes a lot of difference to the pupils and we greatly value your help.

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

Launch of County Council-supported energy supplier

County Council staff, including those that work in schools are being encouraged to compare their home energy costs, switch and save money.

To encourage more people in Sussex to switch, the County Council has launched Your Energy Sussex which is a new, council-backed energy supplier that provides low-cost gas and electricity to homes across the county.

It offers good customer service and aims to keep customers on the best tariff for them. It is also run on a not-for-profit basis with surplus income paid into a Fuel Poverty fund and used to help Sussex residents that are struggling to pay their energy bills.

In addition to schools and County Council staff, members of the public can also buy their gas and electricity through Your Energy Sussex. The public launch will take place in the coming weeks, but the switching website (www.yourenergysussex.org.uk) and the Free Phone number, 0800 952 0001 are live and open to anyone living in Sussex.

In the coming weeks, Your Energy Sussex is planning to help parents and carers at West Sussex schools reduce their energy bills by promoting the tariff to them. The campaign will encourage parents to switch their energy supplier by offering $\mathfrak{L}10$ per fuel switched to a school of their choice. The offer will be time-limited and more information will be provided soon.

Your Energy Sussex is operated by the County Council's Energy Team. It is a partnership between Sussex local authorities and Robin Hood Energy, a fully licensed energy supplier owned by Nottingham City Council.
