Phil the Bag is coming soon!

A reminder that we are taking part in 'Phil' the bag this year. 'Phil' the bag is a free clothing recycling initiative and will help us to raise funds from the textile donations we receive. Our collection date is **Tuesday 20th March**. All you need to do is put any textiles/clothing in good condition into a bag (black sack, bin liner, plastic bag or old pillowcase) and bring them into school on the recycling morning - we will be collecting all donations in the Laurel Room. The bags are then weighed and a certificate and cheque will be given to us - it really is as simple as that!

What happens next?

These textiles are then sold on and distributed to people who can use and enjoy them in developing countries, which at the same time saves our environment from the burden of further resources going to landfill.

What will they collect?

All kinds of adult and children's clothing, hats, shoes, belts, handbags, and household textiles including sheets, pillow cases, duvet covers, curtains and towels.

They do not accept:

Blankets, Bric-a-Brac, Duvets, Pillows, Sleeping Bags, Rugs, Carpet, Offcuts of fabric, Any WET items, Tent Canvas, ripped or stained clothing

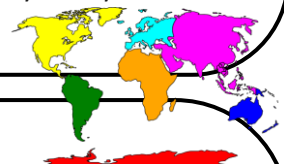


Beach Clean

Snow

Online Safety

Research carried out by Barnardo's has highlighted concerns about Facebook's new Messenger Kids app which is due to be launched soon in the UK. It will allow children as young as six to communicate either in groups or one-to-one, using text messages, video calls and photos, which has raised concerns that children could be at risk from grooming, sexting and online bullying. The charity commissioned a YouGov survey of 997 parents, asking for their views about the app. Ninety per cent of parents said that they were concerned about their children using the new app. 61 per cent said they were worried that strangers would be able to pose as their children's friends on the app.

School Mission

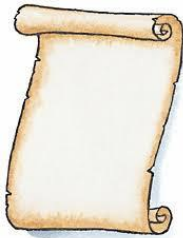
A mission or purpose is something that will always be true and remains unchanged. Our mission is our core reason for being.
