

# Trends in Online Child Sexual Exploitation (International Watch Foundation - IWF)

Recently published IWF research has found that children are being sexually abused online by offenders who coerce, groom or blackmail them. Although this is not a new phenomenon, the age of the children was particularly striking. Almost all the children abused in this way were under 13; nearly 30% were under 10. The children were in their own homes when this abuse took place, often in their bedroom or bathroom, using live streaming technology. In many cases, the children seemed to be unaware that recordings were being made of these live streams, which are then uploaded elsewhere.

Live streaming is a popular feature of lots of apps and platforms. By understanding the risks of live streaming, we can help children stay safe when they are online. ThinkUKnow has produced a guide to help parents understand why live-streaming is so popular, and how to keep children safe.

This year Summerlea is celebrating 20 years. Originally housed on the same site as Rustington Community Primary school, with one class of reception aged children and another with seventeen children ranging from Year 1 to Year 5, Summerlea officially opened on its current site in 1998.

During the next academic year, we want to develop this role further in school so that 'reading for pleasure' is promoted not only by the staff but by our volunteers too. Volunteers would work not just with one class but across the school wherever we felt you were needed most. Volunteers who read to children and who listen to children read can play an important role in the success of our community by having a direct impact on the academic success of our children.

We are looking to develop a key group of volunteer readers, supported by staff, who will share top tips for hearing readers and reading stories out loud. The most important thing is for volunteers to love reading themselves! One of the things that people find difficult when volunteering is committing themselves regularly, which is why we want to develop a group so that people feel able to pop in when they have some spare time. Welcome to the Summer 2018 edition of the SEND newsletter.

Some of you may have heard that West Sussex had an Ofsted/CQC SEND Local Area Inspection during late February/early March.

Thank you to all those families that gave feedback about the SENDIAS service and the Local Offer to the inspectors. With your help it led the inspectors to mention us in their outcome letter that was published on Friday 11th May. They highlighted that the SENDIAS along with other services that provide support to families (including the Independent Supporter Service):

- "is highly regarded by those parents who have used them".
- · "know the issues that parents are facing well".
- "provide very useful support, prioritising the needs of families".

Inspectors also said of the Local Offer "The local offer website is well designed and contains a lot of useful information"... "However, although a large number of parents were aware of the website, many said they preferred to access information from other sources".

We are currently working with the website developers on improving the ability to search for the information, services and events that you need within the Local Offer, to ensure that it is the most helpful place to find the information that you need. 

# SEND Tribunal National Trial - Single Route of Redress

The Government are extending the powers of the First-tier Tribunal (SEND), sometimes referred to as the 'SEND Tribunal', to make non-binding recommendations about the health and social care aspects of Education, Health and Care (EHC) plans as part of a two-year trial. The trial will apply to decisions made or EHC plans issued/amended from 3 April 2018.

To date, you have only been able to appeal the educational aspects of EHC plans. The trial gives you new rights to request recommendations about the health and social care needs and provision specified, as long as you are already making an appeal in relation to the educational aspects

of the EHC Plan under the previous grounds (ie LA's refusal to re-assess, amend, issue a Plan, LA's decision to cease to maintain, description of needs, specified provision, or named placement. This gives you the opportunity to raise all your concerns about an EHC plan in one place.

There will be an independent evaluation of the trial to inform a decision on whether the new tribunal recommendation powers should be continued after the trial.

# Wikis

Wikis are simple, accessible, secure and easy to build personal websites.

- They can be used to create multimedia person-centred plans that use pictures, words, video and sound to capture the voice, skills, aspirations and needs of the individual.
- Wiki's allow individuals and families to share their story in their own way.
- Wiki's are owned by the individual/family they are private and secure and password protected, the owner of the Wiki decides what information from the Wiki they want to share and with whom to share it.

West Sussex are currently piloting a number of personal Wikis across the county and

individuals and their families are already telling us about the benefits to them. We are also developing 6 Public Wikis, 4 of which can be viewed on the website.
