#### **Important Safeguarding Request**

We highly value all the parents and friends who volunteer their time in school in so many different ways. Recent changes in the regulations regarding safeguarding of children have meant that we need to introduce a new process to check the eligibility of people in school. If you come in to school as a helper or volunteer (hearing readers or going on trips for example) you will now need to complete a new declaration form. This is in addition to the DBS check that is required. A copy of the form is attached or please ask the office for a paper copy. We would appreciate these being returned to school the week after Easter. Thank you.

#### Solar Eclipse

Hopefully you have all received the letter about the Solar Eclipse occurring this Friday 20<sup>th</sup> March. There is a guidance booklet "How to observe an eclipse safely" which is available on the school website or can be found at https://www.ras.org.uk/images/solar eclipse leaflet.pdf There is also a video that can be viewed at http://www.popastro.com/ which explains what to expect and how the eclipse can be safely viewed. It is really important that we carefully manage the risk of serious and permanent eye damage resulting from children looking at the sun. We are putting plans in place to make sure children get the experience of the solar eclipse, see it as it happens and gain valuable learning from it but in safety. Therefore, we will be keeping the children in the school building but they will be able to see broadcasts of it in their classrooms. The danger of a child taking a look at the sun, however brief, could be significant and damaging. Please be aware of the dangers as the children come to school. We will be teaching the children about this and reinforcing the importance of not looking directly at the sun and would appreciate parents reinforcing this at home too.

# School Staff/Volunteer Disqualification Declaration - CONFIDENTIAL

In October 2014, the Department for Education (DfE) issued an update to its Statutory Guidance "Keeping Children Safe".

This update requires schools which provide care for pupils under the age of 8, to ensure that staff and volunteers working in these settings are not disqualified from doing so under the Childcare (Disqualification) Regulations 2009. Reference:

- A person may be disqualified through
- 1. having certain orders or other restrictions placed upon them
- 2. having committed certain offences

3. living in the same household as someone who is disqualified by virtue of 1 or 2 above (this is known as disqualification by association)

You are required therefore to sign the declaration below confirming that you are not disqualified under those Regulations from working in this school.

If you fail to complete and return the form, this will be regarded as a disciplinary matter for staff, which may result in dismissal and in the case of volunteers (where required to sign), may mean that you can no longer work at the school.

A disqualified person is not permitted to continue to work in a setting providing care for children under age 8, unless they apply for and are granted a waiver from OFSTED.
