

#### Sussex School Games – LASP Success

Three Littlehampton Area Sports Partnership (LASP) teams went through to represent the Southern Area Partnership (SAP) at the School Games last Wednesday. As a LASP team I think we should be proud to have, out of only 5 primary aged competitors at the game, 3 teams from our locality. School games are a Level 3 competition, being a step up from inter-school and partnership - now county level.

Firstly we need to bear in mind that these three teams have done incredibly well to get through the partnership stage as SAP has in total 68 primary schools. They each competed against 8 other sports partnerships from across the county. The total number of primary schools in the whole county is in excess of 430. An exciting day of competition saw all three sides thoroughly enjoy the School Games experience and judging by their faces they had a fantastic and most memorable day.

St PHILIPS hockey team have come on leaps and bounds and really did themselves proud and so nearly got through to the semis - 5th out of potentially 430 schools! 
