My name is Trudy Jefferies and I'm originally from Yorkshire. I came to West Sussex a year ago, via London, Surrey and Hampshire.



Acoustic Fencing

We would like to inform you that West Sussex County Council have agreed to acoustic fencing being installed on the Orchard Park side of the school's east boundary hedge. This is in order to reduce noise levels from our outdoor learning spaces for the Ochard Park residents. The work is due to begin on Monday 9th November and take approximately three weeks Children and parents should not be affected.

Our Journey towards becoming a Forest School has begun...

Many of us adults will have clear memories of playing outside; adventures and discoveries, wonderment and the thrill of learning something new. This is what we believe is important for all children to experience. Our Forest School is where our children will begin their own journey of discovery, every time they visit.

Forest School is a place where all children will be given the opportunity to experience and enjoy learning in an outside 'classroom' enhanced by the natural elements of the changing seasons, weather and a natural woodland environment. The Forest School approach is a holistic one underpinned by specialised learning theories. It offers ALL learners the opportunity to develop their self-esteem, emotional resilience, confidence and ability to assess and manage risks as well as teaching them a range of new skills and developing a respect for nature.

The sessions may include:

- Problem solving
- Trust games
- Whittling
- Learning to use tools such as saws and drills
- Fire lighting and fire safety
- Mart work
- Music
- Storytelling and writing
- Shelter building
- Tracking skills and sensory exploration
- Learning about plants and animals ...
 - ... And more!



Every time the children visit there will be opportunities for them to work independently as well as cooperatively. The Forest School leader will plan structured sessions, to include some guided activities, but they will be non-directive so that it allows for the learning to be child led. We are really looking forward to our Forest School sessions where the focus is on the learning process rather than the outcome. So, let's pull on our wellies and begin exploring!

As we begin our journey, we are aiming to develop our wooded area where our Forest School sessions will take place. We are hoping to make links with any tree surgeons or similar who might be able to help us source some wood that they cannot use or sell but that the Forest School sessions can put to good use. We will also be looking for volunteers to support at these sessions in the future. If you think you can help, either as a volunteer or with sourcing some wood, please contact Mr or Mrs Strong, via the school office. We will keep you updated as this exciting new project develops.


The 100-word challenge is now being set fortnightly, rather than weekly, to allow the children more creative thinking and writing time!

Summerlea School is an equal opportunities employer and the posts are subject to enhanced DBS clearance. We expect all candidates to share a commitment to safeguarding our pupils.


