### **Staffing and governor update**

We would like to let you know of some forthcoming changes to our staffing and governing body. Whilst we seek to replace Mrs Barnes (not an easy task!) the office will be under-staffed and we thank you in advance for your patience at busy times. We are very grateful that during the interim Mrs Moore's daughter has kindly agreed to help us out when she can.

And finally, Mr Martin Charters (Co-Chair of the governing body) is also standing down at the end of the academic year. Mr Charters has a long association with the school and is a very well respected and well-liked member of the governing body, who has brought a wealth of financial experience to the school. 
### Are your contact details up to date?




### Toilets at home time
