

# Is your child entitled to Free School Meals? What you need to know: Fre

Free school meals are only available in England and Wales.



Your child might be able to get free school meals if you get any of the following:

- Income Support
- Income-based Jobseeker's Allowance or Employment and Support Allowance
- Support under part VI of the Immigration and Asylum Act 1999
- The guaranteed element of Pension Credit
- Child Tax Credit (provided you're not also entitled to Working Tax Credit and have an annual gross income of no more than £16,190)
- Working Tax Credit run-on

Universal Credit, provided you have an annual net earned income not exceeding £7,400 (£616.67 per month)

Please remember that even if your child doesn't want to have the free meal they could still benefit in other ways, through the Pupil Premium funding we would receive as a school (£1,320 for every eligible pupil).

#### **Staffing News**



Our congratulations go to Mrs Voice (Year 1 class teacher) who is expecting her first child. Mrs Voice anticipates going on maternity leave at October half term and as she is on a temporary contract, covering Mrs Crook's maternity leave, we will actually be saying goodbye to her earlier than anticipated but for a very happy and exciting reason. We are currently looking to cover Holly Class and will write to you again as soon as we have got arrangements in place.

We will also be saying a sad farewell to Mrs Howard (Year 6 class teacher) at the end of the autumn term. Following Mrs Howard's return from maternity leave, last academic year, she was ideally looking for a three day per week permanent contract. Unfortunately, our governing body was unable to accommodate this request due to budgetary constraints. As such, after nearly twelve years with us, Mrs Howard has made the difficult decision to seek employment elsewhere and been appointed as Year 6 class teacher at Wisborough Green Primary School, Billingshurst. We are pleased to have already been able to put staffing arrangements in place following Mrs Howard's departure. Mrs Kerrison-Pierce will be working full-time for six weeks up until February half term when Mrs Tedbury then returns from maternity leave. As an experienced Year 6 teacher, Mrs Tedbury will be teaching in Year 6 for two days per week opposite Mrs Kerrison-Pierce.

We would like to take this opportunity to say thank you to Mrs Voice and Mrs Howard for all they have contributed to our school during their time in post. We wish them both all the very best for the future as they begin a new chapter in their lives.

This term we are very pleased to have welcomed three new members of full time staff to our teaching team: Miss Collis (Year 5 teacher), Mr McKerrell (Year 4 Teacher) and Mr Powell (Year 2 Teacher). We are delighted that, as a consequence of the Year 6 staffing arrangements, Mr McKerrell (Year 4 teacher) will remain with us for the duration of the academic year teaching Beech class full time.
