'Est-ce que vous pouvez m'aider?' (can you help me).
























Following on from the maths and reading workshops for parents held earlier in the year, we wanted to update you on some of the actions we have taken so far, after your feedback.

You said: Children in KS1 that have completed the planet reading challenge need something else so they remain motivated.

We did: The Big Bang award has been introduced. This is for 450 reads! (Accelerated reader has also been rolled out across Key Stage 2 this year so enjoyment and motivation for reading will continue into Year 3 and beyond.)

You said: It would be helpful to know the progression through the book band colours.

We did: These are now available to view by visiting our website. Go to Our School > Curriculum & Assessment > English > Reading

You said: We don't know what the children have done at school during the day.

We did: KS1 classrooms (as well as EYFS) now all have 'Ask me about...' speech bubbles in the windows as a way into finding out more about their day.

You said: We'd like to know more about what is being taught on a more regular basis so we can support our children better at home.

We did: Maths pre-teach sessions for parents are currently being trialed. Please try to come along to the next one if you can!
You said: Teachers often recommend
Doodle Maths but we have to pay a subscription fee to access the best resources.

We did: We have invested in My Maths – an online learning resource for Years 1 to 6. Everyone should have received a letter about this, if you haven't please speak to your child's class teacher.

Thank you for the very constructive feedback that was received. We really value your input and support. Next academic year we have plans to start a parent forum to discuss more ideas like these. Watch this space for further information about how to get involved!

Start of the school day

A reminder to parents and carers, classroom doors do not open until 8.20am each morning. We have noticed that some of our older children are arriving at school much earlier than this and are therefore unsupervised on the playgrounds. The children's safety is paramount and so, unless attending a club, please ensure your child is not arriving too early. Thank you for your support.

Absence reporting procedures

If your child is going to be absent from school, please contact us and report this on the absence line. Please ring 01903 856783 and select option 1.

You should leave your child's name, class, the reason for their absence and an indication as to how long they are likely to be away.



48 Hour Rule for sickness and diarrhea

Please remember if your child has been suffering from sickness and/or diarrhea that West Sussex County Council have a strict rule, which dictates that children must not attend school until 48 hours after the last episode. This helps to avoid the spread of sickness bugs within school between children and also staff. Thank you for your co-operation.





The School Exclusion Project

The School Exclusion Project provides free legal representation to challenge **permanent** school exclusion. Their volunteer representatives provide totally free advice and representation at all stages of the exclusion process. They specialise in cases involving children and young people with special educational needs and/or disabilities.

Get in touch with them to access support quickly. They provide advice and representation at the point of exclusion, at Governing Body Hearings, Independent Review Panels and First Tier Tribunals.

When a parent whose child faces permanent exclusion from school contacts the Project, a (trained) student director has an initial discussion to ensure that the case is one that the Project can take on. If the case is one within the Project's remit, the parent is assigned a student representative who prepares and conducts the appeal on their behalf. Approximately 75-80% of their cases involve children with special educational needs.

The student representative will then appear on behalf of the parent before the appropriate decision-making body: the governing body of the school, before the Independent Review Panel (IRP) or before the First-tier Tribunal (FTT) (if the parents allege that the exclusion was unlawful as being discriminatory on the ground of disability). The Project has excellent links with specialist education solicitors. This allows Sarah, or the barrister mentor, to make sure that if the final decision of the IRP or the FTT is unlawful, further advice and if necessary further representation can be obtained.

Autism Alert Card from The National Autistic Society

The autism alert card can be carried by a person who has autism and used in situations where communication may be difficult. The alert card, developed in consultation with adults who have autism and parents, is designed to tell people about the condition and asks them to show respect and tolerance. It can be particularly useful if a person who has autism comes into contact with criminal justice professionals, such as police officers, magistrates and solicitors.

The card comprises a wallet which contains a leaflet of key facts about autism, and a credit-card

Worthing Speakabout

Worthing Speakabout is a fun, member-led group who aim to support members to speak up for themselves, make friends and run interesting and fun projects. Anyone with a learning disability in the Worthing area is welcome to join. Speakabout hold big meetings on the fourth Thursday evening of every month where members invite a guest speaker and explore a topic of interest – for example, relationships, support or important changes happening for people with a learning disability.

Outside of the big meetings, members meet up in small groups with their supporter to run projects – these have included film-making, researching, training people in learning disability awareness, organising events about hate crime, campaigning to make local transport better or performing a roleplay about speaking up for yourself.

New members are welcome to just come to the monthly big meetings, but if you have a passion, interest, desire to learn new skills or something you want to change in your community, you can also help with the projects we have on the go.
