

New Gate Guidance

SECURITY

As you will be aware, from previous communication, we are having an electronic gated system installed at the front of the school by the main entrance to the car park. This will make our school site more secure and our staff car park safer, as well as helping to ensure access is more closely monitored. The children's safety is paramount and this is a facility many larger schools now benefit from.

Installation will take place during the summer holidays and should be in place and working for the start of the new academic year, in September 2019.

In light of this, we are reviewing our current policy in relation to parents/carers being granted access to the school car park in a vehicle. Currently, we allow disabled blue badge holders to utilise the carpark, provided they are not accompanied by an able-bodied adult and there is space for them to safely park. Access is sometimes also authorised in exceptional circumstances, with prior permission from the headteacher.

As from September, any parents/carers wishing to utilise the staff carpark will need to ask for a 'Permission for School Carpark Access' form. These are now available from the school office and should be completed and returned, ahead of September where possible. Authorised access will be at the headteacher's discretion and your form will be returned to you stating whether or not permission has been authorised.

If permission is authorised, then you will be asked to read and sign an agreement form, including a risk assessment.

Please understand that the carpark is first and foremost intended for staff use. Disabled parking spaces are very limited and priority will be given to our pupils who are registered disabled and wheelchair users.

Mrs Gingell has been appointed as a Key Stage 1 Teaching Assistant at East Preston Infant School. 
