At the start of the new academic year we explored the difference between rules and values with the children in assembly. We then asked each class to think about what rules we need to make our school a happy and positive place to learn. Votes have now been counted and verified and we are pleased to be able to share our new 'key three' with you: Be Kind, Be Safe, Be Ready. These will replace our Golden Rules and are really easy for everyone to remember and understand. They are, of course, closely linked with our Summerlea Seven Values and next time you come in to school look out for a new display about these in our main corridor.

Chartwells menu

Please be aware that on the first day back, after the half term break (Monday 4th November) there will only be jacket potatoes on the Chartwells hot meal menu rather than the usual selection of main courses.

Sickness reminder

If your child has suffered from diarrhea and/or vomiting symptoms then it is important that they do not return to school until 48 hours after the last episode and only once they feel well. This policy is in line with advice given to schools by the NHS and helps to ensure that sickness bugs are not easily passed on. Thank you for your support.

Coats

Please ensure your child has a coat in school. The British weather is very unpredictable and even more so than usual at this time of year. We do like our children to be able to go outside to play and to be able to keep warm and dry when they do. Please also check your child's coat has their name inside. Thank you.



Uniform

If your child has their ears pierced they may wear one pair of plain (silver or gold in colour) ear-ring studs. Stud ear-rings should be removed or recently pierced ears should be taped over with a plaster (provided by parents/carers) for PE and swimming. Children's hair accessories should be in school colours only and socks/tights should be plain white, plain grey, plain dark green or plain black. Shoes must be suitable for school wear, plain black and sensible. Please do not be surprised if your child is spoken to and/or asked to remove items if they are not part of our uniform. Thank you for your support.

Safeguarding

1. Did you know...?

<u>Safeguarding</u> is an umbrella term for the things we do in order to ensure that all children are safe from harm. This includes but is not exclusively:

- Record keeping / training / safer recruitment / governance
- Specific policies child protection / Health & Safety / Offsite activities / Attendance / Behaviour etc
- Anti-bullying
- Curriculum
- On-line
- Having a culture of 'It could happen here, it can happen anywhere'
- Empowering staff to identify and respond

<u>Child Protection</u> is protecting a child who has or is likely to be subjected to significant harm.

There are no absolute criteria on which to rely on to determine what constitutes **Significant Harm**. It is often a compilation of significant events, **both acute and / or longstanding**,
which impact on the child's physical and psychological development......

FOOD IS DONATED

Non-perishable food is donated by schools, churches, businesses and individuals.



FOOD IS SORTED AND STORED

Volunteers sort food to check that it's in date and store it, ready to be given to people in need when they visit the food



STEP 3

PROFESSIONALS IDENTIFY PEOPLE IN NEED

Food banks partner with a wide range of care professionals such as doctors, health visitors, social workers and police to identify people in crisis and issue them with a foodbank voucher.



STEP 4 **CLIENTS RECEIVE FOOD AND**

Clients bring their voucher to a foodbank centre where it can be redeemed for threedays' emergency food. Volunteers take the time to listen to people over a warm drink and signpost people to agencies able to help solve the longer-term problem.
