As usual, governors administered the annual Parent View survey during parent view consultation meeting evenings this half term.


Thank you to all of the parents/carers who were able to spare a minute or two to complete the survey on our iPads.

We encourage families to provide a balanced healthy snack and lunch for their child. Children should not have sweets, chocolate bars or fizzy drinks. A reminder also, to please not include products containing nuts in you child's lunch box. We have a number of children with nut allergies and the consequences can be severe and life threatening in some cases. Thank you for your co-operation.



#### **Christmas Cards in School**

Christmas cards are a fundamental and great part of Christmas, and the opportunity to send good wishes to friends is highly valued.

The handling of Christmas cards for delivering and the sheer volume of cards in school, prior to the change we made some years ago, was a growing concern. We calculated that if every child sent a card to each member of their class there would be over 14,400 cards sent in school! Add to this cards to other friends, teachers and learning support assistants, other staff and the adults' own contributions, and it might be somewhere in the region of 16,500 (plus) cards. As a result of considering these amazing figures for one primary school, and in the light of our Eco School Status, it was decided to try and cut this amount.

Following the success and positive feedback from parents/carers, staff and pupils in previous years, Christmas card arrangements this year will be the same as previous years as follows:

- Children can make/buy one card to send to their class (home-made cards are welcome).
- Each child will be given the opportunity to present their card to their class by their teacher.
- All cards will be displayed in classrooms and a class 'winning' card will be chosen.
- All 'winning' cards will be brought together from each class in an assembly; the best 3 cards will be chosen and prizes awarded at the end of term.
- We would like all other cards that children may wish to send to friends distributed (with parents' help of course) outside of school this can be before or after school on the playground.
- Staff will also be encouraged to produce one card for all their colleagues (we have previously had our own Christmas card competition in school!)

We hope all parents will help us in supporting this approach. Thank you.



#### Christmas Parties

Key Stage 2 will be having their Christmas parties on Monday 16<sup>th</sup> December. EYFS will have theirs on Tuesday 17<sup>th</sup> December and Key Stage 1 will have theirs on Wednesday 18<sup>th</sup> December. We ask that each child brings in an individually named 'party pack' to eat – this should help reduce wastage and also avoid putting children with allergies at increased risk. The pack can include light party bites that your child will enjoy such as crisps, fruit, cheese and a sweet treat (please avoid products that contain nuts). Drinks (water and squash) will be provided by school. Parties will take place in the afternoon, after lunch, so your child will not require lots of food. If you have any questions about this please speak to your child's class teacher. Thank you for your support.
