
1st place: Year 3 (badges & magnets) with a total profit of £129.92

News from School Angel

Support Your School



Following on from our last email outlining
the withdrawal of Amazon as a shopping option we
have now had further extensive negotiations with
Amazon. It appears that for legal reasons they can no
longer allow non-profits/charities to donate
commissions earned from sales generated onto users.
However there is some more positive news in that they
will allow the charity to use commissions generated for
the charities own running costs.

Therefore we propose that we continue to offer them as a shopping option and hope that schools do indeed continue to use the links if they are shopping at Amazon.

In turn we plan to boost school's fundraising totals with the separate monies, which we normally allocate for running costs, since we hope to now rely solely on the funds generated from Amazon for our running costs going forward.

We have had to change the wording on your fundraising pages to explain that Amazon shopping does not generate donations for your school and appreciate that this may well be confusing for your supporters. The exact text reads:

'SHOPPING AT AMAZON DOES NOT RAISE ANY DONATION FOR YOUR school BUT AS AN AMAZON ASSOCIATE School Angel EARNS FROM QUALIFYING PURCHASES'

With that in mind it might be a good time to send out a school communication explaining this important change. We will be updating our 'understanding commissions' page shortly to reflect these changes.

At this stage we envisage being able to provide additional funds to schools going forward. This will likely take the format of a funding boost of about 20% when a school reaches a target of £500 raised meaning that we will add an additional £100 making a total of £600 raised, then again at £1100, £1700 etc.

We will of course need to see if the revenues we generate are going to enable us to support this plan so we will keep schools updated.

Helping children cope with stress during the 2019-nCoV outbreak



Children may respond to stress in different ways such as being more clingy, anxious, withdrawing, angry or agitated, bedwetting etc.

Respond to your child's reactions in a supportive way, listen to their concerns and give them extra love and attention.

Children need adults' love and attention during difficult times. Give them extra time and attention.

Remember to listen to your children, speak kindly and reasure them.


If possible, make opportunities for the child to play and relax.





Try and keep children close to their parents and family and avoid separating children and their caregivers to the extent possible. If separation occurs (e.g. hospitalization) ensure regular contact (e.g. via phone) and re-assurance.


Keep to regular routines and schedules as much as possible, or help create new ones in a new environment, including school/learning as well as time for safely playing and relaxing.





Provide facts about what has happened, explain what is going on now and give them clear information about how to reduce their risk of being infected by the disease in words that they can understand depending on their age.

This also includes providing information about what could happen in a re-assuring way (e.g. a family member and/or the child may start not feeling well and may have to go to the hospital for some time so doctors can help them feel better).
