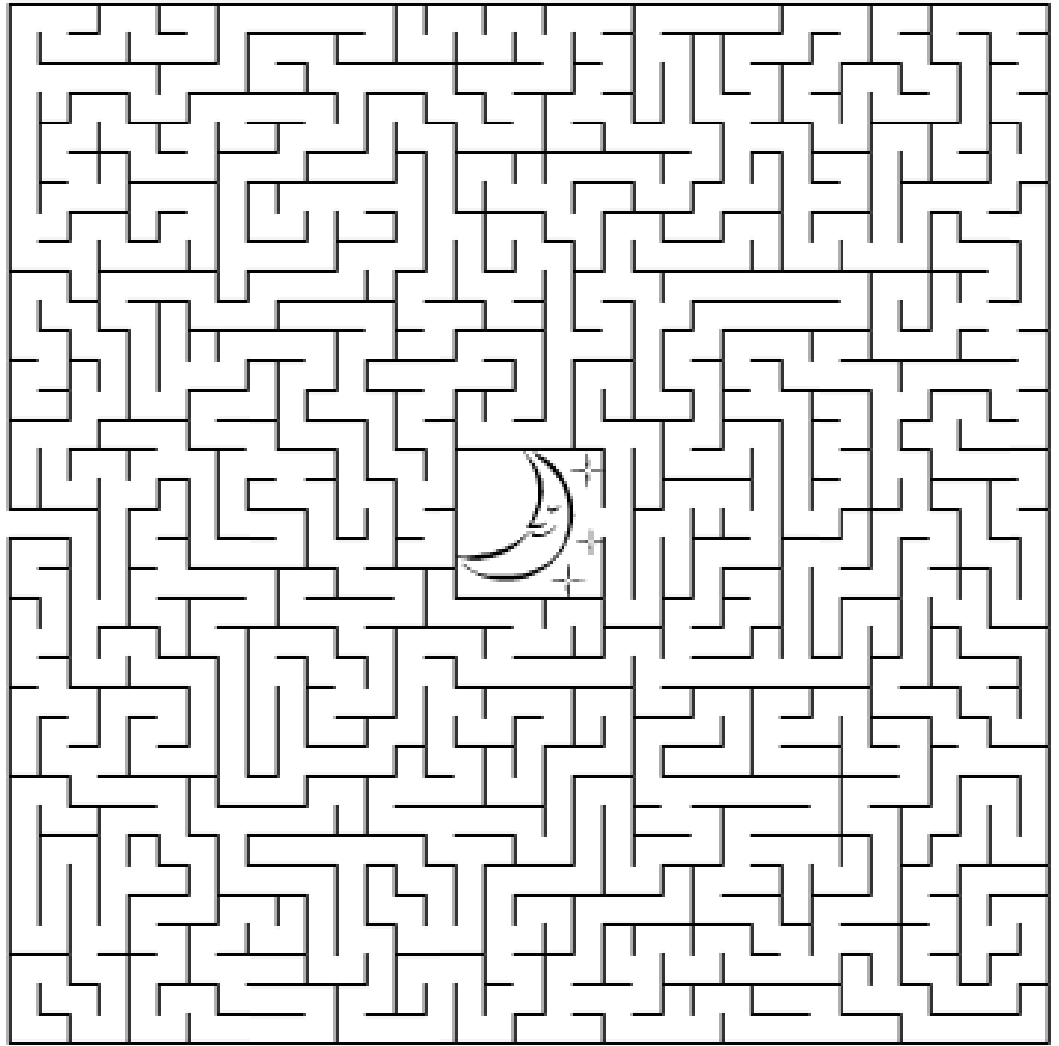


Write the long date and 'Day 43'

Mission to Mars

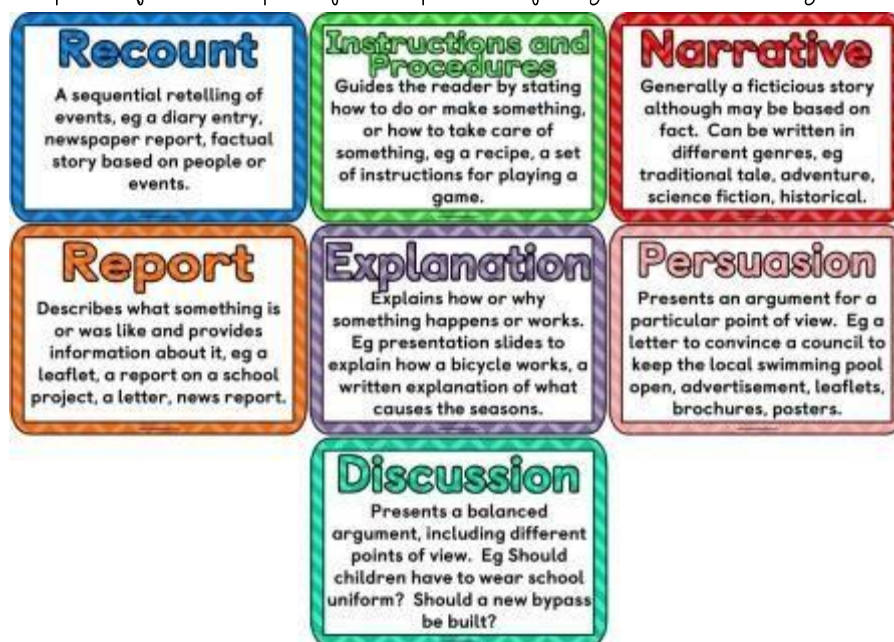
Over the last two weeks, we have enjoyed learning all about space with you!
