ORANGUTAN

Skunk

Habitat: Skunks live in wooded areas. They use holes because they use trees and bushes as shelter. They also live there because that is where they find their food.

INTERESTING FACT: Skunks do a warning dance before they spray.

ADAPTATIONS: Skunks are nocturnal, that means they are active at night. Not all skunks have the signature stripe. Some have spots or swirls.

PREDATORS: Skunks need to watch out for foxes, coyotes, bears and humans.

Diet: Skunks eat a variety of things like insects, earthworms, and plants.

Orangutans are the only member of the great ape family that can be found exclusively in Asia. They are native to Malaysia and Indonesia. In the wild they can only be found in the rainforests on the islands of Borneo and Sumatra.

With arms reaching 7 feet (2 meters) from fingertip to fingertip, orangutans are aptly suited for a life in the trees of Southeast Asia.

How long are the orangutans arms compared to you?

There are only two species of Orangutan and both of these are endangered: the Bornean Orangutan (Pongo pygmaeus) and the critically endangered Sumatran Orangutan (Pongo abelii).

About 97% of an Orangutan's genetic makeup is the same as a human's. Orangutans are so dependent upon trees, they are particularly susceptible to logging. Unfortunately, deforestation and other human activities, such as hunting, have placed the Orangutan in danger of extinction.

- Scientific Name - Pongo abelii/ Pongo pygmaeus
- Type - Mammal

- Average Life Span in the wild - 30-40 years
- Size - (Standing height) 4-5 feet

A female Orangutan has a baby on average only once every 8 years, after it is born the baby will stay with its mother for eleven to twelve years; male Orangutans become fully mature at about fifteen years of age.

GIRAFFES

A newborn giraffe is about 1.8m tall. Within a few hours of birth the calf can run around.

Giraffes graze on acacia leaves.

Fully grown male giraffe is 5-6 m and weighs more than 1000kg. Males are usually taller and heavier than females.

A giraffe has only two galls: walking and galloping. It can reach a sprint of up to 60km/h.

They can live up to 25 years in the wild.

The giraffe's tongue is about 50cm long. It is purplish black in color, perhaps to protect against sunburn. And is useful to groom and clean the animal's neck.

A giraffe's heart can weigh more than 11kg and measures about 61cm long. The heart rate is 150 beats per min.

The answer is 394.

Explanation:

If you take the second statement, 2 is incorrect from the first statement and 5 is incorrect from the fourth statement. Hence 4 is correct, but not on the second place. From the third statement 4 is not on the first place, therefore 4 is on the third place.

From the fifth statement either 6 or 9 is correct. But combining it with the third statement 6 is incorrect, therefore 9 is correct and on the second place.

From the third statement 3 is correct and on the remaining first place.
