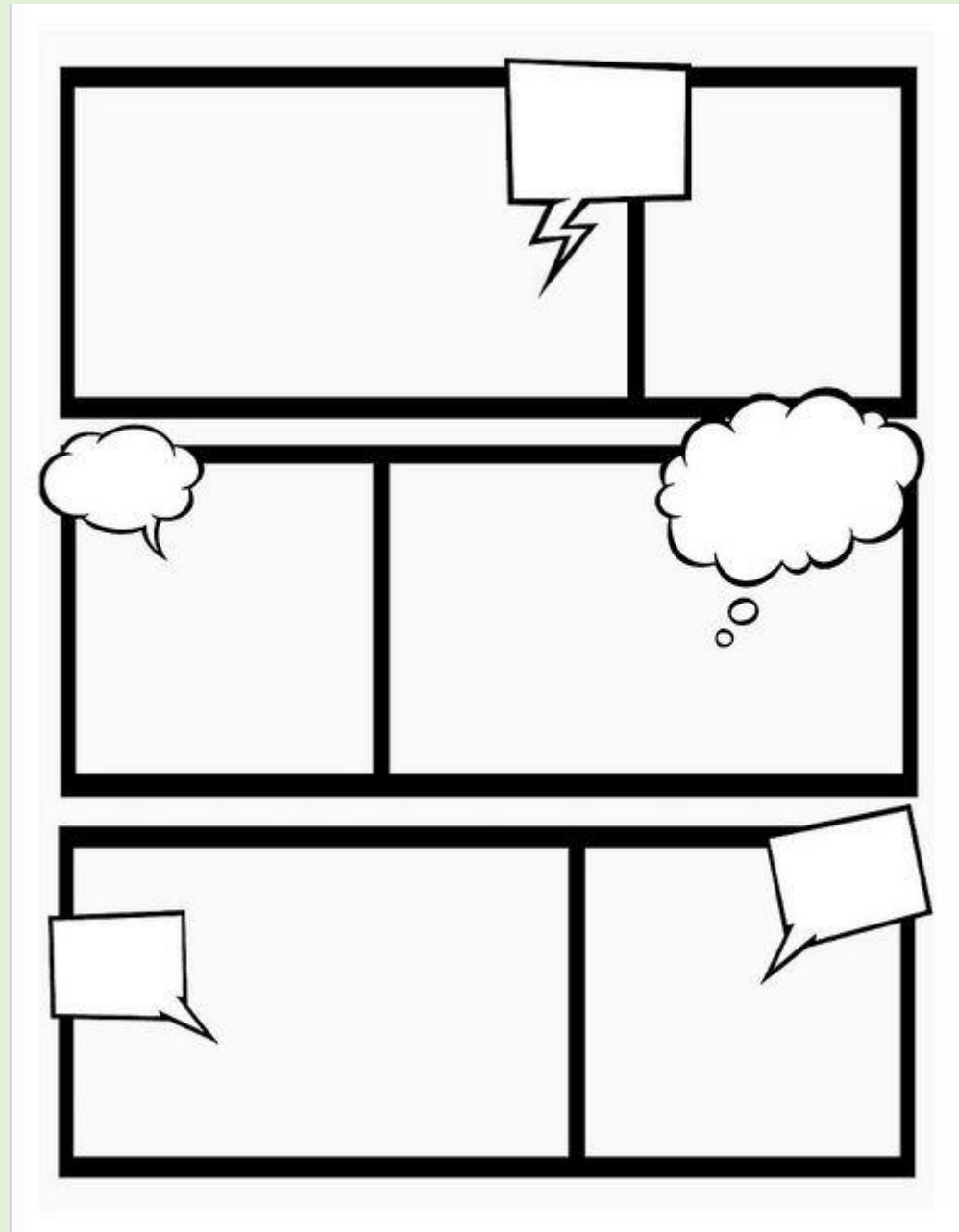
## English : Memory comic strip

### STAGE 3: Running your Zoo (Overheads)

It costs you money each day to run your zoo, and to keep your customers and animals happy. You will need to employ different groups of staff, and each group of staff will need some 'Resources' money to pay for the things they need to complete their job. For example, if you employ zoo keepers, you will need to pay them for their time, but you will also need to provide money for them to spend on food for the animals.

Use this table to calculate how much it costs per month to run your zoo.

First decide how many of each type of staff you require, in the 'Number of Staff' column.

Next, for each type of staff, multiply the 'staff cost per month' number, by the 'number of staff'.

Finally, add on the resources per month for each type of staff. Even if you have lots of each type of staff, you only need to add this number once.

We have left some empty rows, in case you think of any other items or staff members you think you will need for your zoo!
