





- Now read the book. Enjoy looking at the pictures and talking about them.












National Curriculum learning objectives: Reading/word reading: read accurately by blending sounds in unfamiliar words containing GPCs that have been taught; Reading/comprehension: develop pleasure in reading, motivation to read, vocabulary and understanding by discussing word meanings, linking new meanings to those already known

Developing fluency

- · Your child may enjoy hearing you read the book
- Encourage your child to read the dialogue with expression, each of you taking the part
- · Challenge your child to reread their favourite pages from the book. Encourage them to read with expression, as if they are making a recording for the radio.

Phonic practice

- Challenge your child to find words in the book with these spellings and sounds:
- o /ee/ y (e.g. anywhere, empty)
- o /igh/y (e.g. spy, sky/lime))
- Ask your child to find words that contain /i/ g (e.g. legendary, change)

Extending vocabulary

- Look at pages 4 and 5. Ask your child to think of powerful words or phrases (synonyms) that could be used in place of the following:
- a battled (e.g. struppled, grappled)
- o massive (e.g. monstrous, gigantic)
- o grabbed (e.g. clutched, snatched)
- Turn to page 11 and discuss the phrase "school of fish" Explain that this is the official term for a group of fish.

- Turn to pages 22 and 23 and use the maps to talk about what happened on jake and
 Turn to pages 22 and 23 and use the maps to talk about what happened on jake and Turn to payer and what each aspect was in real life. Ensure children understand that the adventure was part of the characters' imaginations.
- o How did the children end up in the sea? (e.g. A big wave apped up the boot and they · Ask your child:
 - o How did Jen save Jake? (e.g. She threw him a rope and pulled him from under a wase.)
 - How did a whale save the children? (e.g. It breached and caused a huge wave which swept them onto the beach.)
 - What other adventures could lake and Jen have at the swimming pool?
