Dear Parents and Carers

We are now truly in the midst of autumn and celebrating harvest festival helps to remind us of the good things we have and to share these with those less fortunate. Thank you for all of your generous donations of items for the Littlehampton & District Foodbank and we will continue our collection on Monday. And, thank you and well done to the Year 3 and Year 1 children and staff for harvest assemblies to help mark this occasion — it has been a pleasure to be able to welcome parents and friends of the school back into school albeit on a slightly different scale to what we might be used to.

Community safety

We have been made aware of a number of concerns from local residents in recent weeks about inconsiderate parking and dangerous driving outside of our school. There was also a near miss this week when one of our pupils was almost hit by a car. This really doesn't bear thinking about. Please drive within the speed limit and with respect and care at all times. A reminder to not wait or park on the roundabout where there are yellow lines and/or zigzags. This is dangerous and puts our community at risk. As the Parking Enforcement Officer always says, a disability badge is not a reason to park dangerously. We have had reports of cars double parking and so restricting road access and the ability for pedestrians to cross safely. We have also had incidences of cars blocking the driveway access of residents in Hollyhock Way. If you witness anti-social parking/driving please report this to the police via operation crackdown. We hope that later in the year we will be able to get our Travel Plan team up and running again to help further raise awareness of road safety.

Punctuality

Please ensure that your child arrives for school on time. Gates open at 8.30am and close at 8.40am. If your child arrives after this time they are late and will need to enter via the office. Please accompany your child to the office so that you can complete a late slip. Thank you.

End of the school day collection arrangements

In order to help alleviate congestion at the end of the school day, I would like to encourage just one adult to come onto site to collect their child/ren and politely ask that older siblings and other family members or friends wait outside the gates but away from the entrance. Thank you for your support with this.





















A few safety reminders

- A reminder to all parents that children (including siblings) must not ride their scooters in the school grounds and must dismount and wheel them. This is for everyone's safety and is a rule all children should be aware of.
- Please do not allow your child/ren to run ahead of you at the start or end of the school day. Your child should be closely supervised please so that we do not have any 'lost' or upset children at these busy times.
- As the evenings start to draw in, please do talk to your child/ren about 'be bright, be seen' and 'stranger danger' – we also do this in school and hearing the same messages at home will help reinforce one of our Key Three - 'Be Safe'.

Time Capsule

Did you know that last term all of the year groups in the school contributed a piece of work and an artefact to add into a time capsule following the pandemic and the partial closure of schools? Mr Strong has now hidden the time capsule in the roof of our building and it is clearly marked 'Do not open until 2031!' We wonder what children will make of it all in ten years time and hope it will provide a hook for some brilliant historical enquiry lessons.

Black History Month

As you may already be aware, October is Black History Month. This year's theme is 'Proud To Be' and people of all ages from minority ethnic backgrounds are being invited to share what they are "proud to be". The main national Black History Month website is an excellent starting point regarding Black History Month 2021 if you would like to find out more. All year groups will be spending some time exploring the concept of Black History Month and a significant individual. Last year, we also had an incredibly generous anonymous donation of books around this theme, which are now in our new library to be enjoyed by everyone.

Scientist of the month

In Science we are looking at a scientist each month whom has made a famous discovery! In October we will be looking closely at Mary Anning, who was born in England in 1799. Mary Anning is famous because she was a palaeontologist (someone who studies fossils) and she discovered many Jurassic period fossils - this includes being the first ever person to find a complete skeleton of an Ichthyosaur. Her most famous discovery was when she found a Plesiosaurus; a marine reptile with four flippers. This was significant as the skeleton was nearly complete! Mary Anning discovered all of these fossils despite not having a formal education and had to teach herself many subjects including geology. Her discoveries were not appreciated in her own time but she is now being recognised for her amazing work! Staffing news

What did she discover?

Mary was a fossil collector and palaeontologist born in England, 1799. She discovered many Jurassic period fossils on the coast of Lyme Regis (now nicknamed 'The Jurassic Coast' for this reason). In 1811 she was the first to find a complete skeleton of an Ichthyosaur (a large marine reptile over 5 metres in length!)

In 1823 Mary found the Plesiosaurus, her most notable discovery. She found many other Jurassic fossils, including the remains of a pterosaur (later known as the Pterodactyl).

Her discoveries have contributed to our understanding of Jurassic animals and aided scientists in understanding the concept of extinction.

As a woman in Georgian times, Mary had little formal education, yet she still taught herself many subjects including geology and anatomy. Her discoveries were first met with scepticism and even after her fellow male scientists concluded that her discoveries were real, she was not credited for her work. Despite this, Mary didn't let misogynistic behaviour and lack of recognition stop her and carried on fossil hunting. She is now finally recognised for her incredible discoveries.
