### Earth day

On Thursday 26<sup>th</sup> May we will be celebrating Earth Day in school (which actually officially fell during the Easter holidays). Earth Day is the annual event dedicated to awareness about the various environmental challenges that face our planet. Co-ordinated by the Earth Day Network, 193 countries around the world have their own version of celebrations. In many places, Earth Day forms part of Earth Week: a longer period of climate awareness that includes activities and campaigns. We are combining Earth Day into our whole school science week this year. The 2022 version of Earth Day will be the 51th anniversary of the event.

So, how are we going to celebrate Earth day at Summerlea?

• During the day, we will teach without the lights on and try to use minimal technology!

- We will invite children to bring in a meat-free lunch and discuss how eating meat can affect climate change.
- Each year group will have a different theme and activity that they will focus on during the day, as well as a linked high-quality key text.
- In the afternoon, each class will share with another class their learning about Earth day.

The aim of the day is for children to have fun learning about the importance of investing in our planet and to become passionate about looking after our environment. Thanks to Miss Barnard (geography leader) for co-ordinating this themed day – a first for Summerlea!

### **SEND Greenpaper Roadshow**

Our roadshows are independent events which will give parent carers an opportunity to find out about the SEND Review and for us to gather their views and present them as a collective voice. Alternatively, Parent Carers can come and gain information and feed their views back and we can direct them on how to do this. Ultimately the purpose of our roadshows are to communicate what the SEND review is all about and the gather parent carer views. We have a combination of times and locations in the hope of being accessible as possible.

The aim of the Green Paper is to reset and further reform the SEND system following the 2014 Children & Families Act. It considers what is wrong with the current SEND system, what needs to change and how we can make that change happen. It looks at some specific areas where parent carers asked for change, as well as unpicking the areas where we need more clarity, and those parts of the paper that are of concern.

Our Green Paper Roadshows must be booked.
