
I would like to take this opportunity to thank both Miss Camble and Mrs Dale for all they have contributed to our school and its staff and pupils - they will both be very much missed and I am sure everyone will join me in wishing them every happiness in the future.

Parent consultation meetings

A reminder that parent consultation meetings are taking place with teachers in the first week back after half term. Please ensure you have requested an appointment, know when your allocated time is and arrive a bit before this. All parents should come into school via the main reception and there will be an opportunity to look at some of your child's work whilst you wait. If you are unable to make a meeting then please let your child's class teacher know so they can arrange an alternative mutually convenient time to meet.

Attendance and punctuality

We still have a number of children arriving late to school. School begins at 8:30am which means learning begins. If your child misses the start of the day, they are missing key learning and important routines and messages. From Monday 17th October **any child arriving late will need to have a late form completed by their adult** at the office. The parents and carers of children in Year 5 or 6 that walk to school alone will receive an email asking them to complete and return the late slip stating the reason. This must be completed each time a child is late. The chart below shows lateness per year group from the start of term until 13.10.22.



Please also ensure you are on time for pick up. Our school day ends at 3pm for all year groups, every day.

A reminder that we are running a parent focus group on Thursday 20th October at 9am to support you with getting children into school every day and on time. Please contact the office if you would like to attend.

Lunchtime Life Skills

A HUGE 'shout out' to our amazing Midday Meals Supervisor Team who are working hard to help our children have enjoyable lunchtimes. Many of our younger children are struggling to

use a knife and a fork so we are focusing on developing this skill. We hope you can support us with this by practising at home too!

When sorting out lunchtime disagreements between children on the playground, our supervisors:-

- 1. Listen: listening to each child in turn without interruption and without an audience
- 2. Summarise: the adult will summarise what each child has said to ensure they have heard and the child knows they have been listened to
- 3. Next steps: children will be asked to come up with their own solutions and if they can't, an adult will help with this
- 4. Resolution: children agree the next step and the adult will ensure that the child knows that the problem has been dealt with and it is time to move on

The School Pupil Council are currently working hard to look at ways to improve lunchtimes. Watch this space for updates!

Trading Cards

Trading cards (football, Pokemon etc.) are not to be brought into school in case they get lost or damaged. They are only allowed in school if a trading card club is running. Thank you.

After School Care Club (ASCC)

Please ensure that if your child is not going to require their space at ASCC that you let the office or Mrs Dyke (ASCC Manager) know as this place could then be offered to someone else. This also applies if your child would usually attend but is representing the school at a LASP event. As per our policy, if ASCC are not informed in a timely manner then you may still be charged. If you are interested in your child attending ASCC on a regular or ad hoc basis, please do contact the office or speak to a member of the ASCC team for further details.

A reminder that we break up for half term next Friday 21st October. Term resumes on Monday 31st October.

Free School Meals – October 2022 Half term arrangements

Voucher Scheme

Following additional funding from the Government's Household Support Fund, West Sussex County Council is pleased to announce that families with Free School Meal eligible children will once again be entitled to a voucher for each FSM child during the upcoming October half term, as well as the Christmas break period and the February 2023 half term.

FSM eligible families in West Sussex will be entitled to a £15.00 voucher per child for the week of the October half term.

For children who are not FSM eligible but whose families need urgent support with food here in West Sussex, we have the Community Hub operating.

Evouchers has been selected to facilitate these upcoming schemes for all schools across West Sussex. Schools that previously issued vouchers to parents used the Edenred platform.

Community Hub

Those children and families that are not eligible for FSM will be able to access urgent support for food via the WSCC Community Hub. The Community Hub can be contacted on $0330\ 222\ 7980$ and is open 9:00-17:00 seven days a week. Further information can be found via the West Sussex County Council website.
