- Something waterproof to sit on (could be a carrier bag)




Crossing Patrol

Safeguarding

We regularly share guidance with parents about age restrictions for social media. It is good to see that Instagram is planning to take further measures to ensure users are the age that they say they are. It will be interesting to see what actions other platforms take too.

In June 2022 Instagram announced they were introducing new age verification technology to select countries, slowly expanding worldwide. This new technology is <u>Yoti</u>.

- You will need to prove your age if you are signing up for a new account.
- You will need to prove your age if you attempt to change your date of birth to appear over 18.

EBSA - Emotionally Based School Avoidance

We know that many children and young people worry about school, which is normal. Sometimes their worries may increase to the extent that they have difficulties with engaging or attending parts of the school day or are experiencing challenges to attend school. This is sometimes referred to as Emotionally Based School Avoidance (EBSA).
